#### **Assembly Bills**

1. Protects and Expands Apprenticeships

**AB 235 (O'Donnell).** Bifurcates existing apprenticeship system to protect existing programs and governance and create a new system for emerging industries.

#### SIGNED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 80-0 (8/31/18) SENATE: 37-2 (8/31/18)

Ban For-Profit Charter Schools AB 406 (McCarty). Prohibits for-profit charter schools, as well as for-profit entities from operating charter schools.

#### SIGNED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 46-27 (5/31/17) SENATE: 28-9 (7/2/18)

 Return-to-Work Fund AB 553 (Daly). Would have guaranteed that permanently injured workers received all funds to which they're entitled under the Return-to-Work Supplement Program.

#### VETOED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 52-23 (5/31/17) SENATE: 26-13 (8/27/18)

4. CSU Support Staff Merit Salary Adjustments AB 1231 (Weber). Would have restored salary steps for California State University (CSU) support staff.

#### VETOED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 54-23 (1/29/18) SENATE: 29-10 (8/23/18)

Charter School Transparency AB 1478 (Jones-Sawyer). Would have ensured that charter schools and entities managing charter schools were subject to the Ralph M. Brown Act and the California Public Records Act.

FAILED ON ASSEMBLY FLOOR: 27-50 (1/29/18)

Collective Bargaining over PAGA AB 1654
 (Rubio). Provides that collective bargaining agreements in the construction industry may provide for processing PAGA claims through the collective bargaining agreement process.

ASSEMBLY: 60-20 (8/31/18) SENATE: 25-14 (8/28/18)

Free Lunch in Charter Schools AB 1871
(Bonta). Requires charter schools to provide low-income students with a free or reduced-price meal during each school day, as required in other public schools.

#### SIGNED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 56-22 (5/30/18) SENATE: 31-8 (8/23/18)

B. School Parental Leave Equity AB 2012

(Medina). Requires community college certificated and classified employees on parental leave to receive no less than 50% of their pay regardless of the pay differential system used by the district.

#### SIGNED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 51-22 (5/17/18) SENATE: 29-10 (8/27/18)

9. Janitorial Worker Sexual Harassment

**Training AB 2079 (Gonzalez Fletcher).**Would have created a peer-to-peer training program in the property services industry to prevent sexual harassment and assault.

#### VETOED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 53-25 (5/29/18) SENATE: 26-13 (8/29/18)

10. Organizing Rights for Part-Time Playground Workers AB 2160 (Thurmond). Ensures that part-time playground workers in merit districts and community colleges are included in the classified service with a right to organize.

#### SIGNED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 51-27 (5/29/18) SENATE: 26-13 (8/28/18)

11. Cal/OSHA Reporting AB 2334 (Thurmond). Improves the accuracy and accessibility of employer reports on workplace injuries and illnesses and creates greater transparency over public self-insured employers' workers' compensation claims.

#### SIGNED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 48-30 (5/31/18) SENATE: 27-12 (8/29/18)

12. Protects Women in the Trades AB 2358

(Carrillo). Creates protocols for training, prevention, and handling of discrimination and harassment claims in apprenticeship programs and allows unions to deny apprentices to employers who do not protect them from harassment or discrimination.

#### SIGNED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 78-0 (5/29/18) SENATE: 39-0 (8/29/18)

13. Restricts UC Contracting Out AB 2361

**(Weber).** Would have required increased transparency and accountability of the University of California's outsourcing practices.

#### VETOED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 54-24 (5/31/18) SENATE: 23-16 (8/24/18)

14. Home Care Registry AB 2455 (Kalra). Allows Labor organizations to access the list of home care providers for the purposes of employee organizing, representation, and assistance activities.

#### SIGNED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 47-31 (5/31/18) SENATE: 26-13 (8/24/18)

15. Sexual Harassment Tracking AB 2713

(Rodriguez). Would have assisted the administration, legislature, and the public with identifying patterns of misconduct across all state agencies through a centralized system for tracking complaints for sexual harassment.

#### VETOED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 72-6 (5/30/18) SENATE: 39-0 (8/21/18)

Cannabis OSHA Training AB 2799

(Jones-Sawyer). Requires cannabis employers to send a worker and a manager to at least 30 hours of workplace safety and health training.

#### SIGNED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 55-22 (5/14/18) SENATE: 33-6 (8/31/18)

17. Warehouse Tax Subsidies AB 2853 (Medina). Would have required warehouse developers to disclose job quality standards before receiving local economic

subsidies.

**VETOED BY GOVERNOR** 

ASSEMBLY: 52-21 (5/17/18) SENATE: 26-9 (7/5/18)

**IHSS Peer-to-Peer Training AB 2872** 

(Carrillo). Would have created a peer-to-peer training for In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) providers.

#### VETOED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 63-15 (5/30/18) SENATE: 28-11 (8/27/18)

**Skilled and Trained Workforce Compliance** 

AB 3018 (Low). Increases compliance with skilled and trained workforce statutes by improving public agency reporting, creating penalties for noncompliance, and providing the Labor Commissioner with the authority to issue a CWPA against a contractor or subcontractor found in violation.

#### SIGNED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 54-23 (5/30/18) SENATE: 26-13 (8/29/18)

20. Prohibit Forced Arbitration AB 3080

(Gonzalez Fletcher). Would have prohibited employers from requiring workers to sign away their rights as a condition of employment or from firing workers because they don't want to sign forced arbitration agreements.

#### VETOED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 47-31 (5/30/18) SENATE: 26-13 (8/22/18)

21. Sexual Harassment Joint Liability

AB 3081 (Gonzalez Fletcher). Would have extended joint liability for companies using temporary or contract workers to protect workers who are sexually harassed or discriminated against and created a presumption of retaliation when workers were fired after reporting sexual harassment.

22. Bail Reform SB 10 (Hertzberg). Eliminates forprofit cash bail system based upon whether a person can afford to pay and replaces it with a risk assessment system administered by public employees.

23. Worker Retention SB 134 (Hernandez). Requires worker retention at regional centers and

provides increased transparency over operational costs to clients and the public.

24. Protections from Union Busting

SB 866 (Budget). Streamlines process for dues deduction, protects employee privacy at orientations. and extends protections to prospective employees, including IHSS workers.

ASSEMBLY: 55-25 (6/18/18) SENATE: 23-14 (6/18/18)

25. Expanded Union Leave for Stewards SB 1085

(Skinner). Requires public agencies to allows union members to take a leave of absence to serve as stewards and officers.

#### SIGNED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 57-23 (8/23/18) SENATE: 26-13 (5/10/18)

(Leyva). Would have removed the financial incentive for providers to move patients on dialysis and in

28. Port Truck Driver Misclassification SB 1402 (Lara). Raises standards in the port trucking industry by holding retailers liable if they contract with trucking companies that have unpaid wage judgments against them.

#### SIGNED BY GOVERNOR

ASSEMBLY: 53-27 (8/30/18) SENATE: 24-15 (5/30/18)

29. Community Pharmacy Staffing SB 1442 (Wiener). Requires pharmacies to employ an assistant when a pharmacist is on duty.

ASSEMBLY: 70-10 (8/31/18) SENATE: 33-5 (5/10/18)
